The keynote presentation was given by Dr. Leslie Smith (Professor Emeritus from the University of British Columbia) on waste rock storage area dynamics, focussing on areas of potential concern. The **Independent Environmental Monitoring Agency** is a public watchdog for environmental management of **Dominion Diamond Ekati ULC's** Ekati Diamond Mine, located approximately 310 km northeast of Yellowknife in the Northwest Territories.

The Agency was established under the **Environmental Agreement** negotiated in 1997 by the company and Aboriginal, federal and territorial governments. The Environmental Agreement is a legal instrument to ensure Dominion Diamond Ekati ULC, the Government of Canada and the Government of the Northwest Territories respect and protect land, water, wildlife and the land-based way of life essential to the well-being of Aboriginal Peoples.

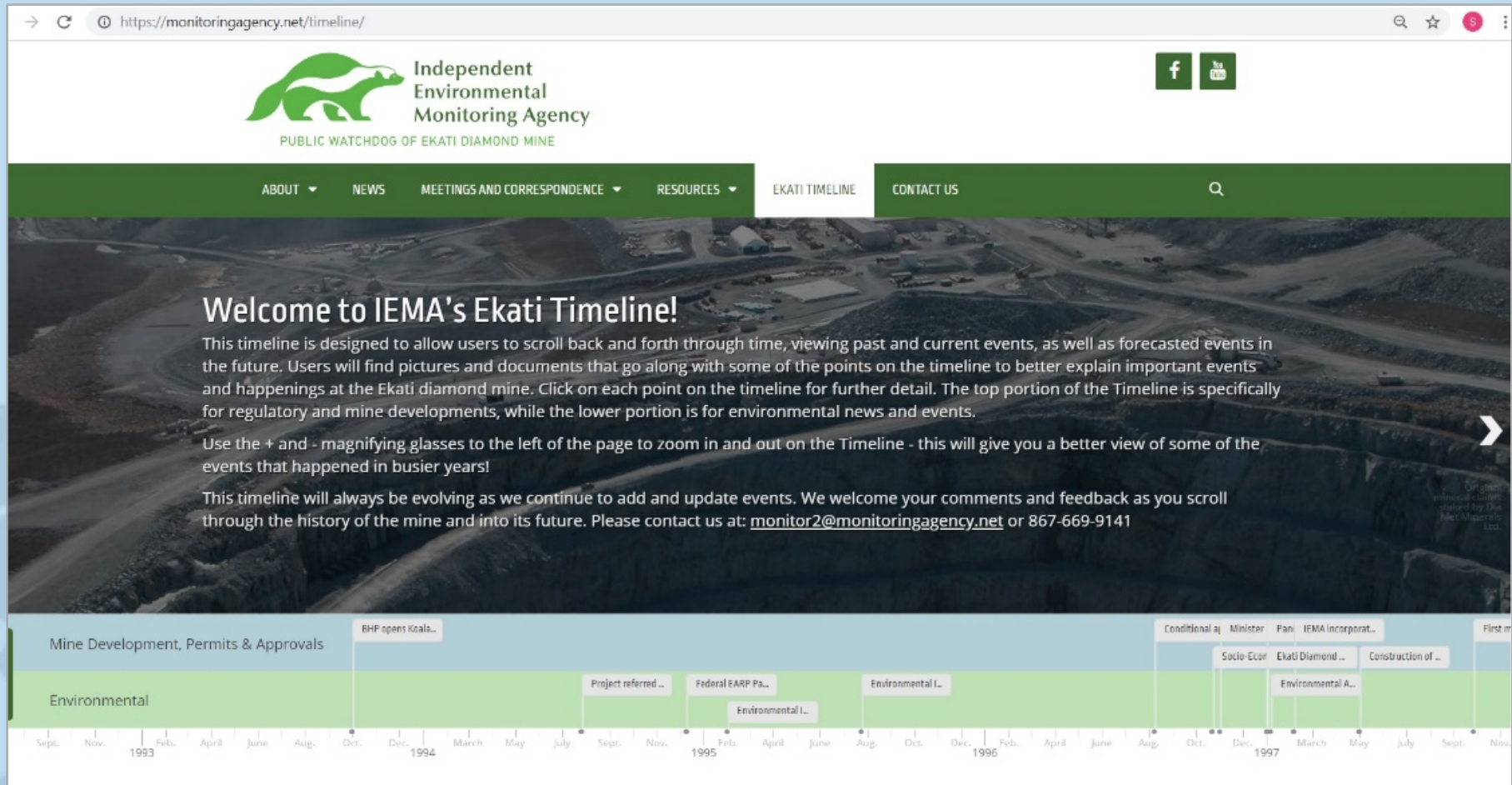
