Re: IEMA comments on 2011 Aquatic Effects Monitoring Program (AEMP) Report

The Agency is pleased to submit this letter and accompanying comment table as our input into the review of the 2011 AEMP report.

We commend BHP Billiton for improving the format of the contaminants figures. For example, Figure 4-1) includes more information on contaminant trends (increasing and decreasing) and magnitude of change than presented in previous years. The figures also delineate the baseline period more effectively for contaminant trends.

We also appreciate the greater use of plankton ecology in assessing biotic changes in mine-affected lakes. Understanding the implications of changes in lake environments for food chain impacts will be greatly improved. The AEMP's new emphasis on gauging food chain impacts in its ecological approach to plankton monitoring is a welcome addition. We will follow the developments in this area of investigation as the AEMP moves forward.

In closing, we note that the AEMP continues to be comprehensive in scope and has the ability to detect changes in the sampled parameters that can alert managers to emerging problems. We look forward to receipt of the next report, with the fish monitoring results being of particular interest.
