RE: BHP Billiton request to change AEMP sampling program to Augustonly lake water quality sampling

Dear Sarah:

Fisheries and Oceans Canada (DFO) has reviewed the request by BHP Billiton to change the open water lake sampling from single samples in July, August and September to triplicate samples in August. Additional information has been provided by BHP Billiton to support this change, as required by the WLWB in the conditional approval of the revised AEMP.

DFO agrees that sampling should not be done for the sake of sampling, and supports the concept of more intensive sampling in August. However, prior to approving this change in open water lake sampling, BHP Billiton should demonstrate conclusively that it will not reduce the effectiveness of the AEMP to detect environmental effects. It is the opinion of DFO that the information provided by BHP Billiton is currently inadequate and needs to be expanded upon before an informed decision can be made.

Why were only five parameters (Chloride, Sulphate, TDS, Nitrate, and Total Ammonia) selected for analysis? There is no mention of metal concentrations or their variability within the three months that are currently being sampled even though some metal concentrations have been identified as increasing over time. Analysis should be performed on all water quality parameters identified in the AEMP to determine whether August- only sampling is justified.
