# Terminology

- Different people use different words/languages to describe the same thing
- Sometimes leads to confusion
- Makes it harder to translate
- Different regulators, provinces and countries also use different words in their legislation

### Reclamation Workshop Terminology

# Terminology – 4R's

- Restoration
  - Return to conditions before mining (physical, chemical, biological)
    - Includes surface and groundwater patterns, plants, and animal ecosystems
  - Few instances where 100% restoration is possible
- Reclamation
  - Restore physical, chemical and biological quality of air, land and water regimes
  - Improve or make better, but not the same as before
  - Return to viable and where practicable, self-sustaining ecosystems
  - Processes that transform land back to the flow of normal changes of the landscape



# Terminology – 4R's

- Rehabilitation
  - The return to a form and productivity level that conforms to a defined land use
  - The return of disturbed areas to a safe, stable, productive and selfsustaining condition
- Remediation
  - To correct problems so that they are no longer considered a human or environmental health problem
  - Procedures or strategies used to address a hazardous waste site
  - Activities carried out to clean-up or mitigate contaminated land or water



## Terminology Goals/Objectives/Criteria

- All three terms used interchangeably in regulatory documents (water licenses, reclamation guidelines, reclamation policy, reclamation plans, permits and environmental agreements)
- · Guidelines, rules, characteristics,
- Endpoints, set of indicators to prove successful completion
- Statements of conditions
- Means of judging performance



#### Terminology Goals/Objectives/Criteria

- Webster's Dictionary
  - Goal: the end toward which effort is directed
  - <u>Objective</u>: something toward which effort is directed: an aim, goal, or end of action
  - <u>Criteria</u>: a standard on which a judgment or decision may be based
